Capital Transit Assistance Program for Urbanized Areas

Eligible applicants:

Urbanized Area Transit Capital Assistance program funds are apportioned to Urbanized Areas (UZAs) with populations at least 200,000. The designated representative for a local or regional transit agency can apply directly for this grant.

Eligible Projects:

- Transit ITS
 - o Mobile computers
 - o Scheduling software
 - o Automatic Vehicle Location
- Preventative Maintenance
- Public Transportation Equipment or Facilities
- Rehabilitating or remanufacturing a bus
- Pedestrian and bicycle access to public transportation facilities
- Construction or renovation of intercity rail stations and terminals
- ADA complementary paratransit (less than 10% of apportionment)
- Crime prevention and security expenses
- Mobility Management

Project Requirements:

- Preserve or create jobs
- Contribute to cleaning our environment through green purchases and retrofitting existing facilities
- Making public transportation opportunities available to more people
- Helping ease the fiscal problems at the state and local level
- Get the money working in the economy as quickly as possible

Application Deadline:

- September 1, 2009 – at least 50% of funds must be obligated to a grant
- March 5, 2010 – remaining funds must be obligated

Capital Transit Assistance Program for Non-Urbanized Areas

Eligible applicants:

For non-urbanized area (less than <200,000 in population) funds, the State is the only eligible applicant. Individual transit agencies must then apply for money directly from the State.

Eligible Projects:

- Transit ITS
 - o Mobile computers
 - o Scheduling software
 - o Automatic Vehicle Location
- Preventative Maintenance
- Public Transportation Equipment or Facilities
- Rehabilitating or remanufacturing a bus
- Pedestrian and bicycle access to public transportation facilities
- Construction or renovation of intercity rail stations and terminals
- ADA complementary paratransit (less than 10% of apportionment)
- Crime prevention and security expenses
- Mobility Management
